3. Purposes and legal basis for data processing

Your personal data is processed for the following purposes:

- 1. **Registration and organization of the conference** (Article 6(1)(b) GDPR performance of a contract, and Article 6(1)(f) GDPR legitimate interest of the controllers).
- 2. Ensuring communication related to conference participation (Article 6(1)(b) GDPR performance of a contract).
- 3. **Financial settlements, invoicing, and payment processing** (Article 6(1)(c) GDPR legal obligation).

- 4. **Compliance with legal regulations, e.g., tax and accounting regulations** (Article 6(1)(c) GDPR legal obligation).
- 5. To ensure the security of the event and control access to the conference (Article 6(1)(f) RODO legitimate interest of the administrators).

Providing data is voluntary, but necessary to participate in the event. Failure to provide data will prevent registration and participation in the conference.

4. Scope of Data Processing

The joint controllers process the following categories of personal data:

- Identification data: first name, last name.
- **Contact data:** email address, phone number.
- **Organizational data:** affiliation with an institution, position.
- Participation-related data: event registration, attendance at sessions, dietary preferences.
- Payment data (if applicable): bank account number, invoicing details.
- Image: if permission is granted to publish photos and recordings for promotional purposes.

5. Data Recipients

Your data may be shared with the following entities:

- Companies providing IT services, operating the participant registration system.
- Entities providing hotel, transportation and catering services to the extent necessary for the organization of the conference.
- Providers of accounting and financial services to the extent of handling payments and invoicing.

Data will not be transferred to countries outside the European Economic Area (EEA).

6. Data Retention Period

Your personal data will be stored for the period necessary to fulfill the purpose of data processing.

7. Rights of Data Subjects

According to the GDPR, you have the following rights:

- **Right of access to data (Article 15 GDPR)** the right to obtain a copy of your data and information about its processing.
- **Right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR)** the right to correct inaccurate or outdated data.
- **Right to erasure ("right to be forgotten") (Article 17 GDPR)** the right to request the deletion of data in specific situations.
- **Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR)** the right to request a restriction on data processing in certain cases.

- **Right to data portability (Article 20 GDPR)** the right to receive your data in a structured format.
- **Right to object to processing (Article 21 GDPR)** the right to object to data processing based on the controller's legitimate interest.
- **Right to withdraw consent** in the case of processing based on consent, at any time without affecting the lawfulness of prior processing.
